When most people think of pets, they imagine puppies or kittens, but why not consider keeping a pill bug (a.k.a. roly-poly) or two as a pet? What better chance to observe decomposers at work? You'll need a large glass jar or terrarium.

- **1.** Cover the bottom of your jar with moist soil. If you're feeling fancy, you can even plant a mini fern or some moss from your yard or a local garden store.
- **2.** Head outside to collect some fallen leaves and bark. Add a layer of each on top of the soil. You can also add a few twigs and pebbles to help your roly-polies feel at home.
- 3. Now start flipping over rocks and logs on the ground to look for your new pets. Gently pick up a few cute little roly-polies with your fingers. (Don't worry! They can't bite, sting, or spread disease.) Place them in their new home.


- 4. Pick out names! You might consider Queen Rot, Uncle Fester, or perhaps Professor Decay?
- **5.** Back inside, fill a spray bottle with water and gently mist your decomposers' habitat. You'll want to do this every day.
- Feed your roly-polies fruit and vegetable scraps or leaf litter from outside regularly, and record your observations. Roly-polies are nocturnal, so they're likely to be busy munching on their rotten snacks while you're asleep.
